The Indian Constitution guarantees justice to all. Accordingly all Indian citizens are guaranteed equal rights of life and personal liberty. Apart from these public rights, there are various private rights arising from torts and contracts and also the various social welfare legislations such as Contract Labour Act 1976, Equal Remuneration Act Minimum Wages Act and so on. But these rights are of no avail if an individual has no means to get them enforced. Rule of law envisages that all men are equal before law. All have equal rights but unfortunately all cannot enjoy the rights equally. The enforcement of the rights has to be through the courts, but judicial procedure is very complex, costly and dilatory putting the poor persons at a distance.
