Rabindranath Tagore (1861-1941) was a dramatist, poet, novelist, short-story writer, painter and composer apart from being social reformer, activist and educationist. He was awarded the Nobel prize for literature in 1913 for 'Gitanjali', a collection of poems. He is perhaps the only person to claim the credit for writing anthems of two countries - India and Bangladesh. In the poem from 'Gitanjali', the poet criticises the orthodox ways of worshipping God. For him, God is not confined in the four walls of so called holy places of worship. He can be found among the common people working hard in rain and in sun.

- (3) What does the poet criticise in the Poem of 'Gitanjali'?
- (4) Where is God, according to the Poet?

History has indeed been expremely unkind to the 'Adivasi' people in India. None of their brave fights against the British has ever been treated as part of the 'national' struggle for freedom. From the Bihar Uprising of 1778 to Lakshman Naik's revolt in Orissa in 1942, the 'Adivasis' of India repeatedly rebelled against the British in the Northeast, Bengal, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra. Gujarat and Andhra. The struggle was terminated only because the British acceded to their immediate demands, as in the case of the Bhil revolt of 1809 and the Naik revolt of 1883 in Gujarat. But while the 'Adivasis' kept fighting in the hills and forests, the rest of India was being educated and 'Civilised'.
