Indices soar to lifetime highs

Key indices ended at record highs today supported by gains in telecommunication and automobile shares as investors ignored weakness in markets. Markets was firm after a volatile start, breaching new highs throughout the session. Light short recovering the derivatives segment towards the end of the trade also pushed Sensex and Nifty higher.

The Sensex ended at 14515.90, up 112.13 points or 0.8 per cent. It touched a record high of 14526.51 intraday.

The Nifty provisionally ended at 4215.75, up 32.25 points or 0.8 per cent. It rose to a lifetime high of 4219 in the session.

Brokerage JM Morgan Stanley today said it expects the Sensex to touch 15200 in the short-term. The combined turnover on both exchanges was Rs. 13900 crore, down 14 per cent from Friday. Among mid-cap indices, the CNX Midcap and the S&P CNX 500 indices ended up 0.5 per cent each. The BSE Consumer Durables Index ended up 1.5 per cent.

Biggest gainers at Nifty were Reliance Communications, up 4.9 per cent at Rs. 515.05, Housing Development Finance Cooperation, up 4.4 per cent at Rs. 1820.35 and Reliance Energy, up 3 per cent at Rs. 549.45.

Telecommunication shares gained, as investors are bullish on the sector due to higher profitability amid rising subscription base. Telecom Regulatory Authority of India on Friday cut port charges by 23-29 per cent.

The Cut in port charges, which are paid by private operators to state-run companies for using the latter's infrastructure, is expected to boost profit of telecom companies. Port charges are applicable for inter-service provider calls.

HDFC hit a lifetime high of Rs. 1828 today. Brokerage DSP Merrill Lynch has recommended a "buy" rating on the stock with a target of Rs. 1900, citing rising value of the company's subsidiaries.

Reliance Energy gained today on reports the company may bid assets of global power major Globeleq by mid-February. State Bank of India settled 1.4 per cent higher at Rs. 1198. The bank's chairman said SBI may opt for rights or pubic issue in 2007-08(Apr-Mar) to raise capital. The BSE Auto Index today ended 2 per cent higher.
