SENSEX CLOSES AT RECORD HIGH OF 36.5 K.

Mumbai: The sensex settled at the highest closing level of 36,548 points on Thursday, tracking firm global cues and an appreciation in the Indian rupee. Earlier in the day, the sensex had touched an intra-day record high of 36,700 points, breaching the previous high of 36,444 points reached on January 29, 2018.

Globally, the Asian and European markets traded in the green after reports on Wednesday said China and the US may resume talks to ease the ongoing trade tensions.

Index-wise, the nifty closed at 11,023 points - higher by 75 - points from its previous close of 10,948 points. The sensex which had opened at 36,424 points, closed higher by 282 points at 36,548 points. The previous day's close on sensex was 36,266 points. As mentioned, it touched on all time high of 36,700 points during the intra-day trade and a low of 36,422 points. Broader markets, however closed on a negative note with the S & P BSE midcap falling 0.52% and the S&P BSE small-cap ending a tad lower, by 0.06% from its previous close. The BSE markets breadth was bearish with 1,469 declines against 1,170 advances.

"Positive cues from other global markets helped sentiments" said Deepak Jasani, head of retail research at HDFC Securities.

Investment-wise, provisional data with exchanges showed that foreign institutional investors sold scrip worth Rs. 742.63 crore while the domestic institutional investors bought stocks worth Rs. 366.40 crore. Sectorwise, the S&P BSE banking index gained the most by 273 points, followed by the oil and gas index, which was up 233 points and the energy index rose by 126 points.

On the contrary, the S&P BSE metal index fell by 191 points, the IT index was down 84 points and the metal index ended 65 points lower from its previous close.

The other major gainers on the sensex were Wipro, up 2.44% at Rs. 279.50, L&T up 1.94% at Rs. 1,299.75; HDFC, up 1.74% at Rs. 1,961.75; and SBI up 1.49% at Rs. 262.75 per share. The top losers were Vedanta, down 3.05% at Rs. 211.35; Infosys down 1.95% at Rs. 1,294.6; Tata Motors down 1.68% at Rs. 152.30; Bajaj Auto, down 1.66% at Rs. 3,101.9; and Mahindra and Mahindra, down 1.4% at Rs. 917.55 per share.
