- What are the two main criteria for a research question / goal to qualify as a good research question / goal ? Using this understanding, write three examples of a good research question / goal. Which one(s) of these three examples, according to you, meet the two criteria the best ?
- What is research? What are the five types of research described by Michael Quinn Patton? For each of these five types, state the main purpose, focus, and desired results. Which two types of research, according to you, are most useful for architects and why?
- 4 Starting with "Introduction", state the other four major components (parts) of the structure of a typical research thesis. Write elaborate notes on any two of these five parts. Which is the most difficult part to write in / for a research thesis and why?

- **5** Write short, intelligent and intelligible notes on any four of these five topics:
 - (A) Role and importance of research in general and in Architecture
 - (B) Dependent and Independent Variables.
 - (C) Literature Review, its roles, and uses in a research thesis.
 - (D) Interrelationship between Goal and Objectives. Give an example.
