The jackal tried to stop him, because he thought that the gardener may come and beat him, but the donkey did not listen to his advice. Ignoring the jackal, the donkey sang so loud that all the farmers arrived and started beating Gardhav. The jackal ran away to save his life. After some time Gardhav joined his friend, he was groaning in pain. He got a lesson.
- 5 (a) Read the following passage and answer the questions: 7
- Prevention is better than cure; and it is recognized that the only way to get rid of malaria completely is to get rid of the flies and mosquitoes, which cause it. Malaria is always associated with damp and marshy land. This is not because the land is damp, but because standing water is the breeding place to the mosquito, which begins its life as a larva living in the water. Malaria does not occur in dry desert countries because mosquitoes cannot breed there. The only way to destroy mosquitoes is to prevent their breeding in the standing water. This can be done by draining all ponds and pools, and by keeping them covered in the 'breeding' season with a film of kerosene oil, which, by depriving the larva of air, kills it.
