THE SPEAKING TREE

On Good Friday, we express our solidarity with large swathes of humanity who have daily struggles with despair, grief, fear, loss of hope and distress. This year, as we have just emerged from the third wave of the Covid pandemic, we can pray for those who have been victims of the disease, those mourning the death of their loved ones and those struggling to cope with the consequences. We remember all the victims of the war, aggression and violence in Ukraine.

The last four days Holy Week begin with Maundy Thursday for many Christians, followed by Good Friday and Holy Saturday that climaxes on Easter Sunday. Maundy Thursday is the day which commemorates the Last Supper of Jesus with his disciples, when he washed their feet and instituted the Eucharist. This he did when he invited his disciples to share the bread he broke and the wine he offered, as his body and blood. Good Friday, a day of grief, is followed by a day of waiting on Holy Saturday, when we experience the emptiness of the tomb and the deep silence that fell after Jesus's death. This is followed by Easter Sunday, when we wake up to the glad tidings that Jesus has risen from the dead.

The body of Christ hanging on the cross evokes a mix of emotions. It brings with it great sadness and grief, the experiencing of a great loss and the desire of many to feel some of the peace and surrender of Jesus which they struggle to find in their own lives.

This act of self-sacrifice on the cross is something that has inspired many men and women of good faith, to live a life of self-sacrifice, by giving up homes, country and their wealth and belongings to serve God both at home and in faraway lands. It may sound strange that self-sacrifice is the path to spiritual fulfillment and that love can overcome all things, even death. But, as history shows us, this is true.

Let us not, therefore, be disheartened and sad like the disciples, who thought that was the end of Jesus's story and their own stories, because morning did arrive, when agony was changed to glory suffering in the life is not the end of our stories. It will end with a vision of God and be the culmination of lives lived for humanity's sake and God.
