Feb.4 Equities recovered smartly on the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) on Tuesday following heavy buying by speculators and foreign investors. Reflecting the uptrend, the BSE sensitive index opened at 3322.04 and closed at 3377.63 showing a gain over the previous close of 3324.22. The BSE-100 advance by 17.40 points to 1476.72. The BSE-200 and Dollex settled at 327.98 and 152.23 compared with 325.01 and 150.81 previously. The leading operators from Calcutta were extending support to favourite scripts like Tisco and SBI.
